





Key updates on Coylton Greener Grid Park

Public Exhibition Update

Statkraft would like to thank members of the community who took the time to attend our Public Exhibition for Coylton Greener Grid Park at Ochiltree Community Hub on 19 September 2024. At the exhibition, we presented our proposals to submit a Section 36 application to Scottish Ministers which will increase the capacity of the site to 150MW.

We welcomed 17 visitors and generally received positive feedback. People were interested in any potential changes in the visual impact and we were able to confirm that we expect the appearance of the project to remain the same as the consented 50MW scheme.

Attendees also had questions about the ongoing construction works for the first phase of the project and plans for our Community Benefit Fund. Find out more about community benefits below.

Coylton Greener Grid Park commenced construction in July 2024. The project was consented in February 2024 and will deliver much-needed grid stability to maximise the amount of renewables that can be utilised on the grid – we have created this <u>short animation on YouTube</u> which explains why we need developments like the one at Coylton.

We expect to submit the Section 36 application in the winter of 2024/2025 and will keep you updated as plans progress. The information provided at the exhibition is available to view on our website at www.statkraft.com/coylton.

Community Benefits Fund

We place a high importance on being a good neighbour, and Statkraft are pleased that as part of this project, an annual fund of £20,000 will be available to the local community, with a focus on projects that help accelerate the transition to a low carbon society. We have appointed GrantScape to administer our community funds from our Greener Grid Parks. You can find out more about them at www.grantscape.org.uk

GrantScape would value your input as a Ward Councillor at this set-up stage. Matt Young from GrantScape is cc'd on this email, and will contact you directly to explore this further – **we would welcome input from you via email, phone, online meeting or in person**. The aim is for the fund to be set up and ready to accept applications next year.

Community Liaison Group


Statkraft is also seeking to establish a Community Liaison Group (CLG), separate to the discussions concerning the administration of the Community Benefit Fund. The CLG will operate throughout the construction phase with the purpose being for Statkraft and its contractors to provide regular updates on construction, minimise disruption and enable community representatives to ask questions and raise any issues. This will help guide our approach to providing construction updates to local residents. We'd welcome your input into this group and are also approaching Ochiltree and Drongan Community Councils to be involved in the Community Liaison Group should they wish to join.

Next Steps

To help make the most efficient use of people's time, we are intending to arrange a meeting with the Community Councils and Grantscape to discuss the Community Benefit Fund. When this is arranged, we would look to run another meeting about the Community Liaison Group in conjunction with this.
