The Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 Ackron Wind Farm Pre-Application Advice – Visualisation Viewpoints

Thank you for your email which we received on 15th May 2020 providing us with additional information in support of the Akron Wind Farm proposals in the Scottish Highlands. We note that this information includes assessment viewpoints for the proposals, and we have reviewed these for our historic environment interests. This includes world heritage sites, scheduled monuments and their setting, category A-listed buildings and their setting, and gardens and designed landscapes (GDLs) and battlefields in their respective inventories.

You should also seek advice from the Highland Council's archaeology and conservation service for matters including unscheduled archaeology and category B and C-listed buildings.

Our Advice

We are content with the heritage assets identified for detailed assessment. We welcome that sites beyond 10km study area will be assessed for indirect impacts, as requested in our Scoping response (19 November 2019). However, we have some further advice which may be of assistance regarding the proposed viewpoints and the status of designated sites proposed for assessment.

Although Knock Stanger (Scheduled Monument, SM458) lies outwith the ZTV for the proposals, inward views of the monument from Sandside Bay would likely contain the proposed turbines. We therefore recommend that further visualisations demonstrating the impacts on the setting of the monument caused by the turbines appearing in these views are included in your assessment. In addition to this, we note that the information provided states that Creag Bhreac Mhor, stone rows 200m ESE of (Scheduled Monument, SM 2386) is located outwith the ZTV for the proposals. This is, however, not clear from the ZTV information included within the consultation (Ref: 138-REP-022) and we therefore consider that this should be clarified in your assessment.

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We also note that some of the designations included in your assessment are inaccurate. Reay Old Parish Church, for example, is identified as a listed building (LB14980). It should be noted, however, that Reay Old Parish Church was de-listed on 22 September 2016. This site is now designated as a scheduled monument (Reay, burial ground, old church and cross slab, 175m E of Parish Church, Scheduled Monument 615). The adjacent Reay Parish Church and enclosure wall is listed, however, at Category A (Reay Parish Church and enclosure wall, LB14992). We recommend that impacts on the setting of both these heritage assets are informed by separate visualisations.

Regarding the use of photographs, we would prefer that professional images be used for photomontages rather than field photographs, particularly in the assessment of **Halladale Bridge, hut circles 670m NE of, on banks of Giligill Burn (Scheduled Monument SM3304)**. We recommend that visualisations submitted in support of the application conform with standards required for an EIA assessment, as laid out by Scottish Natural Heritage (SNH) in their publication *Visual Representation of Wind Farms: Full Guidance* (https://www.nature.scot/visual-representation-wind-farms-guidance).

However, we appreciate that this may not be possible given current Covid-19 restrictions, so we are willing to accept field photographs at this stage. However please note that we reserve the right to withhold detailed comments on a forthcoming assessment if the imagery is not of a sufficient quality to make our assessment.

Further Information

Ackron Wind Farm Consultation (Ref: Highland Council 19/04756/SCOP; HES Ref: 300034216)

Dear Sir/Madam,

The scoping response dated 19 November 2019 (HES Ref: 300034216) noted that there is the potential for setting impacts beyond the proposed 10 km study area and recommended that further consideration of sites beyond 10 km are informed by ZTV analysis. HES identified the following assets to be assessed which may be impacted be the development:

- Halladale Bridge, hut circles 670m NE of, on banks of Giligill Burn (SM 3304) included in the assessment with a photo wireline representation;
- Knock Stanger, cairn 730m E of Sandside House (SM 458) not within the ZTV but will be included in assessment;
- Reay, burial ground, old church and cross slab, 175m E of Parish Church (SM 615) included in assessment with photomontage, LVIA VP #3;
- Bighouse, garden pavilion and walled garden (LB 7160) included in assessment with a photo wireline representation;
- Sandside House, kiln barn and single storey range of former byres, cottage and dairy and implement shed (LB 14986) –included in the assessment;
- Reay Parish Church and enclosure wall (LB 14992) included in assessment with photomontage, LVIA VP #3; and
- Sandside Harbour 1 and 2, Sandside and Fishing Store (LB 14988) not within the ZTV but will be included in assessment.

We may have to use field photography from site visits for heritage photo wirelines if we cannot get the photographer to site to take SNH style photography due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Please find attached a figure showing viewpoints, noting the following:

- As detailed in the Updated Scoping Report, the turbines have shifted further to the south to reduce the visual effects upon the coast and North Coast 500;
- All heritage assets within 5 km will be included in assessment;
- Selected heritage assets beyond 5 km included within the assessment are documented in the tables below (scheduled monument in Table 1 and listed buildings in Table 2); and
- LVIA photomontages are from Reay burial ground and old parish church (SM615, LB14980) and Shebster Hill (SM476) with heritage photo-wirelines from Halladale Bridge Hut Circles (SM3304) and Bighouse (LB7160).

Could you please provide any comments by Friday 22nd of May?




