Existing View


This view looks out from the seafront at Rothesay. Inland the view looks towards the town with some areas of rising ground beyond. To the north and northeast there are views towards the Cowal Peninsula, set between Loch Striven and the Firth of Clyde with layers of overlapping hills extending into the distance.

Predicted Change

The Proposed Development would be seen above a dip in the hills to the north, with three of the turbines partially visible and the remainder screened by the landform. At night, two of the aviation lights would be visible, seen in the context of lights within the town, but set incongruously above the darker skyline of the Cowal Peninsula.




It is likely that all or most of the turbines at Inverchaolain wind farm (depending on its final design) may be visible from this viewpoint, seen to the left of the Proposed Development.


