Hi Stuart,

Many thanks for your phone call today.

I have double checked and you are right that we did not ask the Craiginmoddie developers for a night time visual from Shalloch on Minnoch. Apologies for the mistaken request for the additional viewpoint on this occasion.

As such we would be happy for you to still do this night time viewpoint but would be content with the night time from Cornish Hill as a standalone night time representation of the impact of the proposal on the WLA.

Notwithstanding this we would still expect the Knockcronal EIAR to include a cumulative assessment of night time lighting on the WLA. This would need to take Clauchrie as well as Arecleoch Xn / Kilgallioch Xn etc into account.

I will redraft our recent consultation feedback to SAC and copy this to Alastair McGibbon and yourself-With regards to the Girvan eye day time viewpoint, we have received this from Craiginmoddie after a recent request and would look for the same from yourselves in order to provide an understanding of impacts on that part of the WLA.

I hope this finds you well.

Thank you for consulting with NatureScot over the choice of day and night time viewpoints to help assess the landscape and visual impacts arising from the proposed Knockcronal windfarm.

Our landscape advice follows on from our email to you of 25 March 2021 and builds on our evolving understanding of potential landscape impacts of windfarms on the more remote areas of the Merrick WLA which have relatively recently come to our attention.

General.

We welcome the Composite ZTV submitted with the pre-application material showing a large number of boundaries / sensitivities. We advise that the Merrick WLA boundary is shown on all landscape-relevant ZTVs and figures.

Viewpoints

Given the theoretical visibility of the majority of the turbines from within the northern part of the WLA we advise that the viewpoint list includes a viewpoint at Cornish Hill *and* Shalloch on Minnoch *and a* viewpoint from the area around Loch Girvan Eye / Craignasheenie Hill. The pre-application ZTVs indicates that up to 12 turbines might be visible at less than 10km distant from this more remote interior location which we believe could amount to a significant impact on this undeveloped region of the WLA

Night time viewpoints and visualisations

As well as *Potential effects on the wild land qualities within the Merrick Wild Land Area* – we advise that the assessment should include an assessment of the effects of night time lighting on the qualities of the WLA. Our recent 2020 technical guidance should be used in this process. <u>https://www.nature.scot/assessing-impacts-wild-land-areas-technical-guidance</u>

Accordingly we advise that two night time viewpoints are included from within the WLA. Given that the assessment should be cumulative and include lights on the Clauchrie wind farm (at Appeal stage) we propose that Shalloch on Minnoch is included for this purpose. This accords with night time visualisations and assessment submitted for the application stage Craiginmoddie wind farm. In addition a night time visual from Cornish hill should also be provided.

Although the applicant might agree aviation lighting mitigation with the relevant authorities – such as ADLS and/or cardinal lighting - we advise the application includes visuals and an assessment of worst case scenario lighting – i.e. 2000cd lights on all hubs.

I hope this advice is helpful in your process of determining the appropriate landscape and visual impact parameters but please note that our advice is given without prejudice to a full and detailed consideration of the impacts of the proposal if it is subsequently submitted as a formal application.

As you will be aware OPEN is undertaking a Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA) as part of the EIA for the proposed Knockcronal Wind Farm, on behalf of Statkraft.

Thank you for your scoping responses in relation to this proposal included in scoping opinion dated March 2021. We have reviewed the additional viewpoints suggested in the scoping opinion and are now in a position to propose a final list of representative viewpoint locations to be used in the LVIA with a view to agreeing these ahead of the assessment.

I have included in the attached, a table which provides a summary of viewpoint locations that have been discussed or suggested through scoping responses. The comments in the table are intended to provide further selection rationale to accompany the suggested final viewpoint list for use in the LVIA, a table listing the final viewpoints is also included in the attached. A map showing the suggested final viewpoint locations, overlaid on the scoping ZTV can be downloaded from the following link - <u>https://op-en.box.com/s/fza49tzwqakzyf6zmu0w86lvpr3bffre</u>

In relation to the SAC comments on the night time assessment, we note that the SAC landscape consultant has requested that 'Lighting effects should be assessed from each of the representative viewpoints and not just from the viewpoints selected to illustrate night-time effects.' It is proposed that the night time assessment for the Knockcronal Wind Farm will consider the visible aviation lights from all viewpoints in relation to number, intensity and distance and a lighting intensity ZTV will be provided illustrating the relative intensity of the lights across the study area within the extent of theoretical visibility of the aviation lights. However, the detailed assessment of the effects of visible aviation lighting is typically carried out from only a selection of representative viewpoints as this is sufficient to form a professional judgement on the likely significance of lighting effects. This is an approach which has been followed for numerous recent night time assessments and tested recently at PLI. It is this widely accepted approach that will be followed for the Knockcronal Wind Farm assessment of lighting.

The assessment of turbine lighting will determine the likely effects on the visual resource i.e. it is an assessment of the effects of aviation lighting on views experienced by people at night. It does not consider effects of aviation lighting on landscape character as it is considered that the proposed aviation lighting will not affect the perception of landscape character, which is not readily perceived at night in darkness, particularly in rural areas. The matter of visible aviation lighting being regarded as a visual effect (as opposed to a landscape one) was recently accepted in the Scottish Ministers' Decision and Report for the Crystal Rig IV consent. Other findings from this landmark Decision will be considered in the methodology that is applied to the night time assessment. The potential visual effects of aviation lighting on the experience of the Dark Sky Park will be considered in the assessment, in relation to visual effects on people who visit this area with the express intention of viewing the night sky.

On a final matter, I should note that the assessment will consider a worst case scenario of aviation lights being switched on for extended periods of time. It will also set out the basis for a range of potential mitigation options that include dimming; horizontal beam control; reduced lighting and transponder activated lights and will identify how these options may mitigate the significance of visible lights at night.

Thank you for consulting with NatureScot over the choice of day and night time viewpoints to help assess the landscape and visual impacts arising from the proposed Knockcronal windfarm.

It has come to our attention that our advice (by email on 13 May 2021) relating to Knockcronal wind farm was not consistent with previous advice provided to other windfarm developers operating in the same area. We apologise for the lack of consistency in our approach which was a result of a genuine error in understanding what we had received from previous applicants.

As a result, please see below for our revised advice which follows on from our email to you of 25 March 2021 and builds on our evolving understanding of potential landscape impacts of windfarms on the more remote areas of the Merrick WLA which have relatively recently come to our attention.

General.

We welcome the Composite ZTV submitted with the pre-application material showing a large number of boundaries / sensitivities. We advise that the Merrick WLA boundary is shown on all landscape-relevant ZTVs and figures.

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Given the theoretical visibility of the majority of the turbines from within the northern part of the WLA we advise that the viewpoint list includes a viewpoint at Cornish Hill *and* Shalloch on Minnoch *and a* viewpoint from the area around Loch Girvan Eye / Craignasheenie Hill. 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We advise that a night time visual from Cornish hill is provided from within the WLA to help provide a sufficiently robust cumulative assessment of night time lighting on the WLA. This would need to take Clauchrie as well as Arecleoch extension / Kilgallioch extension etc into account.

Although the applicant might agree aviation lighting mitigation with the relevant authorities – such as ADLS and/or cardinal lighting - we advise the application includes visuals and an assessment of worst case scenario lighting – i.e. 2000cd lights on all hubs.

I hope this advice is helpful in your process of determining the appropriate landscape and visual impact parameters but please note that our advice is given without prejudice to a full and detailed consideration of the impacts of the proposal if it is subsequently submitted as a formal application.

- Anecdotal information indicates that several properties within the Girvan Water Valley are connected to Scottish Water mains supply, including Balbeg Holiday Cottages and Craigfad on the western side of the Girvan Water Valley and most of the properties in Straiton.
- □. Remaining properties within close proximity of the site are on private water supply systems.
- □. No wind farm infrastructure is proposed to the north east of Linfairn (as show on the map below).

We have had other development sites where Scottish Water asset plans have been incorrect or that infrastructure is no longer used/redundant. As such, we would be very grateful if you are able to check your records and provide information as to where these Scottish Water Infrastructure / assets are located within the planning application site boundary below?



Thank you for sending through the known private water supply information together with your concerns.

We have undertaken a first pass site visit for hydrology last week including identifying properties potentially on private water supplies (PWS) and issuing a PWS questionnaire where initial interviews were not possible.

From this we have identified that there is only one potential PWS source within the catchment of the main wind farm site. That is for Linfairn who have groundwater spring source which is at very low to negligible risk from the development and are financially involved in the development. Dalmorton house cluster and Knockskae have a spring PWS source that is not considered to be hydraulically connected to the site due to the topography and hydrogeological regime.

We are still in the process of gathering information for the potential access track options via questionnaires and all the properties you have listed are being consulted. Once we have reviewed the information responses we would be happy to liaise with you to plan a site visit with yourselves for further detailed assessment of any supply that may potentially be at risk.

We hope this approach meets your requirements at this stage and look forward to working with you.

I have serious concerns regarding quarries or borrow pits, access roads with sites, and bases of turbines and the hardstanding for such. For water crossings, and roads over water feeds to catchments and supply lines. For other

ground disturbance required, such as power line connectors, Forestry removal, planting, etc., within proposed developments.

Great to meet you on Thursday and Friday for our Private Water Supply assessments in relation to Knockronal Wind Farm proposal.

I hope you have had a well earned and relaxing break and the camper is coming on well by the time you read this? Thanks again for the advice on nice little places nearby to stay in the camper!

Hats off to you for being able to juggle all the demands on you with regards Covid, Brexit and ensuring people's water supplies are adequately protected for the future!

In summary, for the Knockronal wind farm development we both agreed onsite that only Glenalla Farm private water supply was potentially within the catchment of the wind farm site, with a section of the existing DGA forestry track (western track) up gradient of a forestry plantation and area of diffuse flow through vegetation that contributes downstream to where Glenalla Farm abstracts its water supply. Glenalla Farm abstracts water from surface water stream approx. 2m upstream of the header tank at around NGR NS 4701, 00256. The header tank is 227 litres with a warped lid that left a gaps for potential biological ingress and was within a fenced off area. The supply has no treatment. The Glenalla Farm track runoff also drained into the watercourse upstream of the abstraction point. The supply has been known to dry out historically and forestry operations when they originally installed the existing DGA track had an impact on the water quality and the Glenalla Farm land.

Attached is a KMZ file of the photos I took whilst on site. These can be easily viewed and copied for use using Google Earth. If you have any difficulties, let me know and I will send you the specific photos for Little Garroch.

As discussed, I have highlighted Morris's situation of being surrounded by wind farms, operations in the area effecting him and his quality of life and that the Gareleffin Ruin next door has been purchased by the Carrick Wind Farm to see if that might be an option for the client. I have also mentioned that Tairlaw Toll did not receive any consultation.





I can confirm that we are content with just the wireframes illustrations and do not consider that full photomontages are required for any of the viewpoints.

Many thanks for this additional consultation in relation to the above wind farm proposal. Here are the answers to your questions (in red):

1. CH1 Knockinculloch, enclosures on E slope of, 600m NW of Glenalla (SM 3357): is a wireline acceptable for this viewpoint? (the site lies within an area of commercial forestry and views are likely to be obstructed)

We are content that wireline visualisations are acceptable for this viewpoint.

2. CH2 Knockdon, enclosure 700m NE of (SM 7491): is a wireline acceptable?

We are content that wireline visualisations are acceptable for this viewpoint.

3. **CH3 Munteoch, settlement and field systems (SM 5200):** the indicative viewpoint (from the farmstead buildings) shows no predicted visibility. Can this viewpoint be dropped, or would you prefer it to be relocated? If the latter, would a wireline from the western edge of the SM be acceptable to show the cumulative impact with Dersalloch?

We would prefer the alternative location viewpoint suggested by you to be used. There appear to be a series of enclosures and possibly some building footings near the western edge of the scheduled area and it would therefore be useful to have an illustration of potential impacts offered by a viewpoint from this area. Again, a wireframe visualisation should be sufficient for our needs at this stage.

 CH4 Blairquhan GDL (GDL 063): Can this viewpoint be dropped in favour of (CH4a)? If you wish it retained (and see comments below), is a wireline acceptable?
 Please see comments below.

5. **CH4(a) (alt) Blairquhan GDL (GDL 063):** from this viewpoint there is minimal predicted (bare ground) visibility, which may be removed following design changes from the layout presented (the turbine tips (as shown) would in any case be screened by intervening woodland). Is a wireline from this location acceptable to demonstrate absence of visibility?

We have considered both the submitted wireframes and we would prefer to retain CH4 rather than CH4a(alt). We consider that CH4 is a more informative visualisation than CH4a(alt). A wireframe would be acceptable.

6. **CH5 Craigengillan GDL (GDL 111):** from this viewpoint there is minimal predicted (bare ground) visibility. Is a wireline from this location acceptable to demonstrate lack of visibility and to show the cumulative impact with Dersalloch?

We are content that a wireframe would be acceptable to demonstrate lack of visibility.

7. **CH6 Kilkerran GDL:** is this alternative viewpoint acceptable? If so would a wireline suffice, or would you require a photomontage?

We are content that a wireframe would be acceptable from this alternative viewpoint location.

Hi Urszula, I hope that you are well. It has been a while since we have corresponded.

I am writing to follow up on comments in your scoping response to the ECU regarding the request for scoping opinion on the above Wind Farm development (ECO00002181). In your response, you approved of our choices of visualisation viewpoints and identified one alternative VP (for Blairquhan GDL) and one additional asset (Kilkerran GDL) for which you suggested a potential viewpoint location. You also indicated that you would welcome further consultation, so that you might provide advice regarding setting impacts.

We have taken your advice on board and we have prepared the attached draft wirelines for your initial comment and provide an updated viewpoints list. Upon review of your letter we noted that there is in fact no predicted visibility of the proposed development from Kilkerran House GDL or from the B741 where the proposed development and the House and GDL would be captured in the same view. In place of that, I have identified a viewpoint further to the northwest, on the opposite side of the valley near the farm of High Newlands, and a wireline from that location is included here.

We invite your comments on the attached wirelines and viewpoint list (for convenience and ease of reference, I also attach the draft ZTV Figure, with designated assets shown). We would welcome your response to the following questions:

We are in the process of progressing the design of the wind farm layout so your comments at this time would be greatly appreciated so that we can finalise our visualisation requirements, which will be reviewed once the layout has been finalised.
